Philippians 3:1-3

- 3 Further, my brothers and sisters, rejoice in the Lord! It is no trouble for me to write the same things to you again, and it is a safeguard for you.
- ² Watch out for those dogs, those evildoers, those mutilators of the flesh.
- ³ For it is we who are the circumcision, we who serve God by his Spirit, who boast in Christ Jesus, and who put no confidence in the flesh—

Philippians 3: 4-6 Paul has every reason...

⁴ though I myself have reasons for such confidence.

If someone else thinks they have reasons to put confidence in the flesh, I have more:

⁵ circumcised on the eighth day, of the people of Israel (Jacob), of the tribe of Benjamin, a Hebrew of Hebrews; in regard to the law, a Pharisee;

⁶ as for zeal, persecuting the church; as for righteousness based on the law, faultless.

Philippians Ch 3:7-9

- ⁷ But whatever were gains to me I now consider loss for the sake of Christ.
- ⁸ What is more, I consider everything a loss because of the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord, for whose sake I have lost all things. I consider them garbage, that I may gain Christ
- ⁹ and be found in him, not having a righteousness of my own that comes from the law, but that which is through faith in Christ—the <u>righteousness</u> that comes from God on the basis of faith

Philippians 3:10-12

¹⁰ I want to **know** Christ—yes, to **know the power of his resurrection and participation in his sufferings,** becoming **like him in his death**,

¹¹ and so, somehow, attaining to the resurrection from the dead.

¹² Not that I have already obtained all this, or have already arrived at my goal, but I press on to take hold of that for which Christ Jesus took hold of me

Philippians Ch 3:13-14

- ¹³ Brothers and sisters, I do not consider myself yet to have taken hold of it. But one thing I do (know): Forgetting what is behind and straining toward what is ahead,
- ¹⁴ I press on toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenward in Christ Jesus.

Philippians Ch 3:15-18

- ¹⁵ All of us, then, who are mature should take such a view of things. And if on some point you think differently, that too God will make clear to you.
- ¹⁶ Only let us live up to what we have already attained.
- ¹⁷ Join together in following my example, brothers and sisters, and just as you have us as a model, keep your eyes on those who live as we do.
- ¹⁸ For, as I have often told you before and now tell you again even with tears, many live as enemies of the cross of Christ.

Philippians Ch 3:19-21 Our Glorious Hope

- ¹⁹ <u>Their</u> destiny is destruction, <u>their</u> god is their stomach (earthly desires), and <u>their</u> glory is in <u>their</u> shame. <u>Their</u> mind is set on earthly things.
- ²⁰ But <u>our</u> citizenship is in heaven. And <u>we</u> eagerly await a Savior from there, the Lord Jesus Christ,
- ²¹ who, by the power that enables him to bring everything under his control, will transform our lowly bodies so that they will be like his glorious body
